CONSIDERATION

1. **RESOLUTION 03-908**

Approval of a Relocation Impact Statement and Last Resort Housing Plan (Recommend Adoption)

The Redevelopment Agency of the City of Pittsburg acquired the property commonly referred to as 1611A&B and 1611-1/2A&B Railroad Avenue through a voluntary sale on May 28, 2003. The property was occupied with four households and the Agency is responsible for relocating those households. Pursuant to the *Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended* and the *California Code of Regulations, Title 25*, the Agency must approve a Relocation Impact Statement whenever a residential tenant is displaced due to Agency acquisition.

2. **RESOLUTION 03-909**

Approval of an Amendment to the Lease Agreement By and Between the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Pittsburg and the County of Contra Costa (Recommend Adoption)

The Redevelopment Agency entered into a lease agreement with the County of Contra Costa for the premises commonly referred to as 415 Railroad Avenue on April 1, 2002. The Agreement is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2003. There is an option provision in the Agreement for a three year option. However, the County has determined that it will move to another facility prior to December 31, 2006. The County has requested that the Agreement is amended to include a 60 day termination clause. The County has indicated that they will consider moving at the end of the original term should such Amendment not be approved. Since it is in the Agency=s best interest to keep the County=s tenancy for as long as possible it is necessary to amend the Agreement.

f. **RESOLUTION 03-9886**

Approving Plans and Specifications and Authorizing Bidding for Contract 03-01, 8th Street/Century Boulevard Reconstruction Project (Recommend Adoption)

Contract 03-01, 8th Street/Century Blvd. Reconstruction Project will reconstruct 8th Street from Harbor Street to Herb White Way as well as Century Blvd. from Delta Fair Boulevard to the dividing median on Century Boulevard. The project will also reconfigure the pavement striping to include bicycle lanes, repair curb and gutter, and construct parking on 8th Street.

g. **RESOLUTION 03-9887**

Approve Letter to the State Assembly=s Appropriations Committee Supporting Senate Bill 802 (Recommend Adoption)

Attached is a draft letter from the City of Pittsburg to the Assembly Appropriations Committee supporting SB 802, designating SR 239 and SR 84 as part of the state=s Interregional Road System. SB 802 is an important step toward improving the transportation network in Eastern Contra Costa County.

h. **RESOLUTION 03-9888**

Authorization to Adopt and Implement the Cal-Card Program to Reduce Administrative Costs Associated with Low Dollar Purchases for Staff, Citywide

(Recommend Adoption)

Implementation of the Cal Card AVisa@ Program Citywide will reduce the administrative costs by eliminating those processes associated with low dollar purchases. The purchasing function has realized the administrative savings associated with Cal Card. During the six-month trial period as adopted by Council, the Recreation Services Department has reduced the number of requisitions for processing from 85% to 2%.

i. **RESOLUTION 03-9889**

Acceptance of Calpine=s Completion of the Mitigation Requirements Contained in the Transition Station Agreement (Recommend Adoption)
As a condition of the Transition Station Agreement (Resolution 01-9318) in which the City granted Calpine a new easement over the portion of the City property actually utilized to construction the 115 kv Transmission Line and transition station, Calpine in turn agreed to mitigate the impact of their easement construction errors. The mitigation items have been completed and ready for acceptance.

j. <u>RESOLUTION 03-9890</u>

Endorsing Policies to Encourage Investment in Local Telecommunications Services (Recommend Adoption)

This is asking for support of a resolution endorsing policies to encourage investment in local telecommunications services in California, investment in local communities and increased employment opportunities.

k. **RESOLUTION 03-9891**

Approval of Alice C. Tyler Perpetual Grant Application (Recommend Adoption)

The Recreation Department is applying for the Alice C. Tyler Perpetual Trust Grant in the amount of \$25,000. the City of Pittsburg=s process for any grant application requires a City Council resolution that supports the department=s application efforts. The grant as awarded will be applied to youth and teen services in the Pittsburg Summer Youth Corps.

I. <u>RESOLUTION 03-9892</u>

Awarding a Copier Lease Agreement to Caltronics Business Systems of San Jose, California to Support the Printing and Copier Needs of Staff, Citywide (Recommend Adoption)

City staff received quotes for a 48-month copier lease

agreement on June 9, 2003. The service proposed is a 48-month copier lease agreement for Adigital@ copiers, maintenance, supplies and service to support the printing and copier needs of staff citywide. The lowest responsive bidder was Caltronics Business Systems of San Jose, California. Caltronics Business Systems submitted a quote in the amount of \$70,056 annually.

CONSIDERATION

1. **RESOLUTION 03-9893**

Awarding a Professional Services Agreement to Baton Rouge International, Inc. for IT Services (Recommend Adoption)

On July 21, 2003, by Resolution No. 03-9872, the City Council authorized staff to negotiate an agreement with Baton Rouge International, Inc., (BRI) for Information Technology Services. A final scope of services, cost, and form of agreement for the IT services has been successfully negotiated. The agreement will provide for network administration, hardware maintenance and desk side support for a one year period.

2. **MINUTE ORDER**

Grievance Appeal Review (Recommend Adoption)

AFSCME has filed grievances asserting that collective bargaining agreements for the term of July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002 required the City to make a retroactive payment of salaries to July 1, 2001. The City Manager rejected that assertion and claims that the parties never intended to have a retroactive salary payment. The grievances were received by the City Council and the City Council has been conducting its review of the matter.

3. **MINUTE ORDER**

Library Commissioner Appointment (Recommend Adoption)

In accordance with the City of Pittsburg APolicies and Procedures for the City Council@ adopted by the City Council on September 4, 2001 by Resolution No. 01-9475, the Mayor and Vice-Mayor shall make appointment to standing and ad hoc committees. A need currently exists to appoint a representative to the Contra Costa County Library Commission. The current term of appointment is July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005. Staff has advertised, and one application has been received. The candidate was interviewed on August 11, 2003.

The new fee increase will be collected by the City and deposited in an escrow account until the City successfully negotiates wit the East Contra Costa Regional Fee and Finance Authority (ECCRFFA) and the East County Transportation Improvement Authority (ECTIA) on a revised fee project list, whereupon the monies collected will be applied towards such list.
