I am a member of the Power Plant Task Force for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. Unfortunately, I was unable to provide my input before our letter was sent to your offices. However, there are other important Environmental Justice considerations that have not been examined through the process to date and must be addressed in the EIR as described below:

The Community Survey Report for the Bayview Hunters Point (BVHP) Health and Environmental Assessment Task Force, a representative study of health and attitudes about the environment published in 2001, found that 14% of residents of Bayview Hunters Point eat fish caught in the San Francisco Bay. Bayview Hunters Point, a largely African American population is one of the poorest communities in San Francisco and families rely on fish from the Bay for subsistence. Any disturbance of Bay sediment, known to be contaminated, is a potential health threat and must be considered before a project such as this is approved.

Communities in other parts of the Bay Area have populations equal to or greater than BVHP who rely on fish from the Bay for subsistence. The universe of that population should be determined and proper mitigation identified.
